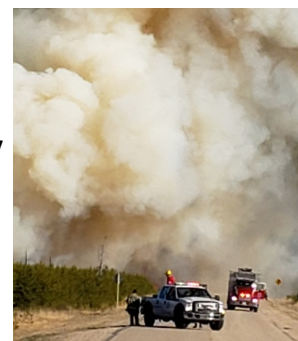
- Community Clean-up (April 2021)

The weekly Senior Congregate Meal Program and the Commit to Get Fit exercise classes resumed in October 2021.



The Querel Family donated a vintage Road Grader to the club and it is permanently staged at the M.A. Querel Community Park. The road grader was operated by Michel Querel, a Woodridge resident for over 30 years up until the mid 70s. Michel passed away March 2021 at the age of 95. The grader is part of our community history as it was used to carve out some of the roadways in and around Woodridge.

One of the major events in 2021/2022, was the devastating wildfire just north of Woodridge in May 2021. The community club was enlisted by Manitoba Conservation to prepare lunches and suppers for the fire attack crews. Over the course of 10 days, a small army of volunteers prepared over 1180 takeout meal for the 65+ firefighters, battling the forest fire.



Looking ahead to 2022/2023 the community club board is hopeful that COVID will be in the 'rear view mirror'. We will continue to act responsibly and cautiously in this 'new normal' (post pandemic) and look forward to opportunities to gather, socialize and participate. We are grateful for the ongoing support of the volunteers, our community and government.

# TREASURER'S REPORT

## ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

### OCTOBER 11, 2022

The 2021/2022 fiscal year saw a slow and cautious transition back to a 'new normal' as Provincial COVID public health orders and gathering restrictions were beginning to loosen. By the end of the fiscal year, we saw some of the community club programs resume with some limitations. We were also able to undertake some fundraising endeavours (i.e. Valentine's Day Spirit and Wine Raffle, Christmas Craft & Bake Sale) through the latter part of the fiscal year. Support from municipal and provincial government grants helped us realize some capital projects and programs including the Mural Project, community centre renovations and the weekly Senior Congregate Meal Program.

Our annual financial statement is compiled by a certified bookkeeper, Jacquie Loeppky with Loeppky Bookkeeping Services. The 2021/2022 (for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2022) unaudited Financial Statement is a statement of income, deficit and retained earnings and not an audit or review engagement. **Based on the financial information and records provided by the Woodridge Community Club, the club has an operating deficit of \$13,229.99. The profit/loss accrual for 2021/2022 has a negative net income of \$3,043.26. Our year end net assets (cash, investments, capital assets) is \$289,992.90**
